STUDENT INTERVIEWS

Current Students' Perspective:

Journey Post-Graduation: Alumni discuss their transition from college to the professional world, how the school prepared them, and any significant opportunities they got because of their education.


Reflections: Looking back at their time at the school, alumni share memorable moments, experiences that shaped them, and any courses or professors that left a lasting impact.
